#### **UPDATE ON LOWER SCHOOL PICK UP**

As referenced in a previous Just the Facts, we have been exploring ways to expedite our car line at pick up. Early in 2025 we will share specifics regarding tweaks to our dismissal process. Englewood parking regulations surrounding the school still do apply. There should not be vehicles parked along Lincoln Street, or the adjacent streets (Walnut Street and Woodland Avenue), for any amount of time.

Preschool 3 and 4 - 2:30 p.m. Kindergarten - 2:45 p.m. Grade 1 - Grade 5 - 3:00 p.m.

Note: If your Lower School child has a sibling in Middle and/or Upper School, please enter the carline at or after 3:25. Middle and Upper School students are dismissed later, and arriving before they are ready is another factor bringing the carline to a halt.


Thursday, April 17th and Monday, April 21st - Thursday, April 24<sup>th</sup>

This time of year we have different illnesses circulating in school. It is always helpful if I can track what illnesses the children are home with so that I can keep an eye for trends in the classrooms. With SchoolPass, I often see the child who is absent marked "sick", without any symptoms (cough, fever, etc) noted. It would be very helpful if you would please write your child's symptoms instead of "sick". Often I will call a parent when I see the symptoms and let them know what is circulating and what has been working for their illnesses, or simply to recommend a doctor's visit.

Also, as the temperature drops, please have your child ready for the outdoors with a warm coat, hat and gloves. Please put a chapstick in their coat pockets so that they can use it before going outside. Many of our students struggle in the winter with chapped lips and by simply using a chapstick before going out prevents that problem.
